Marina Conner is excited to present her research on Sullivan’s Island participation in the Great War. Her presentation, entitled “Moultrieville’s Doughboys” follows the stories of three Island boys as they fought for the United States in the First World War. Only one returned home. The names of the two who died overseas are inscribed on the memorial in the small park at Middle St. and Osceola Ave. Her research celebrates and remembers the armistice and the centennial of the first Armistice Day in November, 1918.

Despite her lack of a traditional southern drawl, Marina Conner is a native Charlestonian through and through. She is a graduate of the College of Charleston where she studied history. Conner currently works for the National Park Service at Fort Sumter National Monument. She considers herself an avid indoorsman and dedicated historian.
